
Provide stability and predictability for large projects
Deliver benefits to local communities through jobs and training
Create great careers in a growing clean-energy industry



Negotiated by project owners, general contractors, unions, and public entities


Agreements happen early—during design or pre-bid stage

Early commitment ensures smooth execution and clear expectations



Union workers gain fair wages, training, and job security
Non-union workers benefit from standardized rules and protections
Developers can scale labor quickly for critical phases
States achieve local hiring and equity goals





Vineyard Wind set diversity and local hiring targets
Ørsted's national agreement supports clean-energy workforce development
CVOW moved from pilot to commercial scale with a PLA for labor stability



PLAs set measurable diversity and inclusion goals
Fund pre-apprenticeship programs like Building Pathways
Include compliance oversight to ensure targets are met



Define clear goals and reporting requirements
Push developers to commit early and reduce uncertainty
Accountability builds trust with communities and labor partners



PLAs create pathways to careers with strong wages and benefits
Deliver community benefits, especially for marginalized groups
Support a future where workers retire with dignity
